The idea was put forward by Iwade Parish Chairman Dave Manning, who unfortunately passed away last year, as a way to keep the village



well kept. The Parish Council supplied some bulbs to the village handyman, Steve Wakeling, to start adding a bit of colour and I will soon be trying to find out what trees in the village have died off and see if new ones can be installed. There will be a village clean up again in June and it will be good to see some new faces there this year. If we all do our bit to look after the vilage we can ensure it stays a great place to live and make it more attractive for visitors.

#### **KEEPING IWADE SPECIAL** by Iwade Parish Councillor Janet Gregory

Nearly 500 additional new homes are already in the pipeline to be built in Iwade under planning permission previously agreed by Swale Borough Council in the current local plan. The new Swale Local Development Framework (next local plan) is due to begin and will run until 2026, which was outlined by Iwade Observer in the last two issues. Last month's front page drew attention to the need for residents to consider the 4 options offered by Swale Council for the next 15 years and urged everyone to respond. We live in a modern village which has evolved to meet the challenges of recent rapid growth and, according to the recent survey mentioned last month, many of us value the village lifestyle and countryside and are concerned about the threat of more development. Option 1 was the only choice which offers no further homes in Iwade, but more development on Sheppey seems inevitable in any case, increasing the traffic on the A249 and causing problems at Junction 5 of the M2. We must do everything possible to preserve our quality of life here in our unique village for the future, and let the powers that be know that we are a Force To Be Reckoned With.

I have been working with the Allotments Committee to have the land for the Allotments handed over. I have been informed by the Swale Borough Council Legal Dept that this will shortly take place and by the time the next Iwade Observer comes out the handover should be completed.

For the past seven years I have been constantly chasing Ward Homes to hand over the old orchard land in Woodpecker Drive. On Thursday the 10th of March they informed me that the land will be signed off on the 10th of March and will then be in the hands of the solicitors to complete. Watch this space.

Sylvia and I have enjoyed our roles as Deputy Mayor and Mayoress. We have opened School Fetes and Exhibitions, visited Care Homes and many organisations and activities in the community. We have met many people from all walks of life. In May our year as Deputies comes to an end, but I hope then to become Mayor and continue the work that we have done over the last year.

For many months I have been working with Head Teacher Katrina Ware in trying to get a Crossing Person outside the school. As usual the wheels of K.C.C turn very slowly. We have been recently been

## Parish Council Notes Taken from the meeting held on the 12th January 2011

The Parish Council was shocked at the sudden death of its Chairman, Councillor David Manning, at the beginning of January. David had been a politician for many years and was an Honorary Alderman of the Borough of Swale. He joined the Parish Council in May 2008, and was Chairman from May 2009 to date. He was passionate about Iwade (a true 'Iwadian') and fought alongside other Parish Councillors to improve amenities within the Village. He was keen on sports facilities and one of his wishes was to see a cricket pitch within Iwade, particularly for young budding cricketers. He had recently become part of the team running and organising the Iwade Farmers Market and had thrown himself wholeheartedly into the enterprise. His Local Government expertise and enthusiasm will be sorely missed by his colleagues on the Parish Council. Our hearts go out to his wife and Sons.

As the Parish Council is without a Chairman, Councillor Gregory agreed to take the chair for this meeting and proposed a few minutes silence to reflect on our lost colleague and friend.

Cllr. Gregory then opened the meeting declaring that in view of the Chairman's death it will be kept brief and only important points will be dealt with.

#### Parishioner/ Public Time

**Parishioners** – The Chairman read out an e-mail from the Hall Committee (Chairman of which was present at this meeting) requesting that representatives of the Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee meet to discuss the possibility of a new hall. Agreed that ClIrs. Hunt, Hurrell and Clerk attend.

**County Councillor and Borough Councillors –** Cllr. Whiting – expressed his sadness at the death of the Chairman. He was pleased that the land for the allotments was agreed by Swale Borough Council.

Temp. Community Warden (Nick Mayatt)/PCSO – Warden's report was circulated and noted by Members. He added that the Warden Scheme has been funded for further two years. PCSO – did not attend.

<u>Finance</u>

**Precept 2011/12** – Clerk advised that she will be submitting the Precept forms to Swale B.C. and as agreed at the last meeting; there will be no increase in the Precept this year.

**Budget 2010-2011** – Clerk advised that following information received from Swale Borough Council regarding Elections, she will increase the amount for the purpose in the budget to £2,000.

**Bus Shelter** – Cllr. Hunt has obtained two quotes from Haymac; one for softwood the other hardwood. Cllr. Whiting suggested there might be some funding

available from KCC. Clerk to contact Highways to ascertain whether permission is needed to replace the existing shelter; particularly if the existing base needs to be altered and whether there are any services under it. This item to be placed on the next agenda.
