

Broadband FAQ

Q: When can I get super-fast Fibre-to-the-Cabinet (FTTC) broadband? A: The new service should be available in the Autumn.

Q: Will I automatically get super-fast broadband?

A: Unfortunately not. You will have to sign up to a Fibre-to-the-Cabinet (FTTC) package.

Q: Can I stay with my current provider?

A: That depends. BT have already announced a package called BT Infinity which will almost definitely be available in Iwade once the network is live. Other providers are currently holding back but we hope that they will get on-board once they have completed trials.

Q: How can I encourage my provider to provide a super-fast package for Iwade?

A: Email your provider to register your interest. Specify that you want to benefit from FTTC when it is live in Iwade in the Autumn.

Q: What speeds can I expect with super-fast broadband?

A: Most areas in Iwade will get between 15Mbp/s and 40 Mbp/s. Some areas between 2Mbp/s and 15Mbp/s. Distance from the cabinet is a factor.

Q: If I incur an installation charge will I be subsidised?

A: Yes it is still intended to subsidise any installation charges of up to £75 per household through the Parish Council.

County Councillors Update

Mike Whiting and Alan Willicombe our Kent County Councillors for Swale Central which covers Iwade have been busy working on our behalf.

According to Mike, 96 percent of pupils got one of their preferred schools, the highest figure for many years, and nearly 80 000 potholes have been filled since the winter.

Alan will shortly be visiting Kemsley Mill with respect to their imminent planning application which could impact Iwade and will ask as many questions as possible to help him make a decision at the planning meeting. Watch this space.

Parish Council Notes

9th June 2010

School Lane Playing Field - Clerk has received a Notice to Determine from the Solicitor acting on behalf of the landowner, stating that the Parish Council is required to quit and deliver up possession of the field on the 16th August, 2010. Clerk approached Hillreed Homes to see whether villagers can use the field once it has been handed over to the company, up to the time development commences. A promising response was received (subject to some form of contract being drawn up) and the matter is now with the developers and the Solicitor.

Broadband - following advice received from Lyndon Gurr of Kent County Council, the Chairman signed the BT Openreach contract. Village Hall - Insurers confirmed cover for the garden area; Clerk pursuing the change of wording on the Village Hall deeds with Land Registry.

Vacancy - The Chairman advised that Cllr. D. White had resigned; Clerk to post the necessary notices. Visitors/Public Time - A resident advised the Parish Council of a possible future planning application in respect of the Speedway.

The building work appears to have ceased on the new 'Waterway' development and concern was raised at the continued closure of the public footpath which runs through this site. Clerk to write to Amicus Horizon to ascertain the current situation.

Councillors - None present

Cllr. Stokes advised the Clerk prior to the meeting that the sickly smell comes from Countrystyle's meat processing plant. The firm has advised him that action is being taken to remedy this.

Temp. Community Warden (Nick Mayatt) - advised Members on action taken regarding fly-tipping in Old Ferry Road; litter in Budgen's car park and Fans Lane, and the hole in the road in front of the Woolpack. He also mentioned the vandalised telephone box in front of the Village Hall, which now has no door, and B.T. won't replace it due to the vandalism it has suffered. It was suggested the Clerk write to B.T. to see if they will relocate the phone box to the village centre, where it can be monitored by the centre's security cameras.

Village Newsletter - Request received from the Village Newsletter's editorial team for a donation to assist with printing costs, (in the past this has been free) which could be in the region of £220 per month for black and white copies. 'One off' payment for this year of £500 granted.

The Progressive Council - Agreed Clerk to attend this conference on the 19th June, at a cost of £70.50p (which includes VAT.)

Plant up the Village - Handyman to obtain bulbs and colourful perennial plants for planting. The Chairman would like to instigate a 'Plant up the Village' competition, plaque awarded for the prettiest street and residents being encouraged to grow plants to bring more colour into the village.
