Parish Councils unite after Core Strategy consultation

Representatives from 10 local parish councils attended two meetings in the summer to share concerns about the public consultation held earlier this year to determine future development in Swale over the next 20 years.

Following no outright public support for any one of the 4 Core Strategy options offered by Swale Borough Council there is major concern that council planners seem to be moving towards a target of 16,000 new houses without improving necessary infrastructure or providing sufficient local employment.

It was felt that many residents were unaware of the online consultation taking place, with not enough emphasis given to the possible loss of agricultural land or potential problems caused by large housing developments and extra traffic on already over crowded roads.

Parish councillors decided that an action group (Swale Residents Against Housing Madness) should be formed to try and influence the outcome by offering a sustainable solution focussing on the needs of existing Swale residents, and not on building excessive numbers of new houses which seem to appeal mainly to London commuters:

Swale RAHM is supported by the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England; the working party meet regularly and also attend Swale Borough Council Local Development Framework (20 year plan) meetings to keep abreast of developments. An information leaflet and poster is being circulated, local media campaigns are planned and more public meetings will held by Swale RAHM.

It appears that Swale Council's announcement of the new plan has been delayed until February or March next year, but comprehensive information is available on the Group's website www.swalerahm.org.uk or write to SwaleRAHM at c/o lwade Parish Council, P.O. Box 588, Sittingbourne ME10 9ET to get involved.

Gordon Henderson MP recently visited a youngster from Iwade whilst he was receiving treatment at the world class Royal Brompton Hospital in London.

Royal Brompton are currently fighting the planned closure of their children's heart unit. The closure was announced at the end of a consultation process by the Joint Committee of the Primary Care Trusts of England as part of a national review aimed at streamlining paediatric congenital cardiac surgery services around the country.

Seven year old, Jacob Pridmore, suffers from a rare lung disorder that affects just one child in every four million. Jacob's consultant, Dr Claire Hogg, explained to Mr Henderson how the loss of children's heart services will have devastating knock-on effects for respiratory services and children like Jacob who rely on access to paediatric intensivists and anaesthetists.

Jacob's mum, Collette Pridmore, has been campaigning with other patients and their families against the unit's closure:

"Jacob has received outstanding care from the Royal Brompton, in particular, from Jacob's consultant Dr Claire Hogg, over the last five years. The unit's closure would have a massive effect on our family. "As Jacob's parents we were delighted when Gordon Henderson agreed to visit the Royal Brompton Hospital. Few MP's have taken the time out of their busy schedule to visit the unit and to see firsthand the

wonderful work this hospital is doing for young children."

Mr Henderson said,

"I found my visit to the Royal Brompton Hospital very informative and it was an honour to meet the hard-working and highly skilled staff on the PICU and Children's Ward. Collette spoke very highly of the excellent treatment her son, Jacob, received.

"I also enjoyed meeting Jacob and I look forward to visiting him at St Peter's Catholic Primary School when he is better."



An emergency or not? Which number you need to use

Kent Police, will be introducing 101, as the non-emergency contact number from, next Monday, 14th November.

Callers, will NOT be put through to a national call centre. Call handlers, in the Force Control Room, will connect callers to their local neighbourhood officer, team or relevant department, to deal with incidents, as required.

Each call to 101, will never cost more than 15 pence, no matter how long the call, what time of day it is, or whether they are calling from a landline or mobile.

Parish Council Notes Taken from the meeting held on the 14th September and 12th October 2011

Matters Arising from the minutes Bus Shelter – Cllr. Whiting confirmed funding for this has been agreed and KCC are sourcing a contractor to install the new shelter.

Yellow Lines - School Lane -Cllr. Whiting confirmed that vellow lines have been recommended on both sides of School Lane, adjacent to the Village Centre – double on the South side and single opposite with parking restrictions between 8.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. Monday to Friday. Consultation on KCC's Countryside Access Improvement Plan – Review 2012 - Cllr. Hyde reported on countryside access. The Byway Officer is to look at the Byway in School Lane. He requested that pathways be kept open when developments were under way - will receive a report in January.

Visitors/Public Time County Cllr. Whiting, stated that both SITA's planning applications at Ridham Dock have been approved by KCC; the permission restricts movement of lorries. Temp. Community Warden (Nick Mayatt)/PCSO - The Warden's report was circulated and noted by Members. There have been problems between allotment holders and residents; one incident was serious enough for him to advise the victim to report the matter to the Police. He has also spoken to the Gypsy Liaison Officer concerning an illegally camped caravan and transit lorry near the Sheppey Crossing.

ROSPA Report – School Lane Playing Field – The report and Risk Assessment have now been received. Two areas highlighted as 'medium' risk; a tree needs taking out and low overhanging branches need to be cut back. The Clerk has instructed the Handyman to carry out the work as soon as possible. Cllr. Phillips proposed purchasing vandal proof fixings to have as a 'standby' to replace bolts that have deliberately been removed.

Finance

Village Newsletter – It has been recommended that advertising cease in the newsletter, this will reduce administration. She also proposed that the Parish Council obtain three estimates for printing a basic newsletter, to be submitted to the next meeting; seconded by Cllr. Harris. Cllr. Jones agreed to obtain the estimates.

Village Hall Updates - Cllr. Hunt reported that the flood risk assessment is now with Planning so things should start to move forward.

Correspondence - Land to the South East of Iwade (SHLAA site SW183) – Crest Nicholson – Proposed by Cllr. Gregory and seconded by Cllr. White that a letter be sent to the company stating that the Parish Council does not wish to engage in discussing the potential of this site for development and refer to the Planning Inspector's report, when he upheld the decision not to include the area of land for housing in the current Swale Plan.

Iwade Mobile Phone Reception By James Hunt - Iwade Parish Council are looking into the problems of mobile phone reception in Iwade and need your help. We really need to know what problems residents are having. It is known that some residents have a bad

signal, text messages that don't get delivered and poor internet access but we need to get a bigger picture if things are to be done to solve these. If you have any mobile problems then please let us know your phone provider, problems you have and what area of the village you have the problems in.
