## IWADE NEEDS YOU!! SAY NO TO MORE HOUSING

Fellow residents, now is the time to protect our village from the large building companies who want to inundate our village with a continuous building programme changing our village into an urban sprawl. Both Wards and Barratts have identified Iwade as a target for more housing for many years to come.

A short while ago interested parties in Swale were able to respond to "Pick your own" options for the future development of the area and I hope you responded. If you did not, you can still make your voice heard. You can also read the comments made at http://swale-consult.limehouse.co.uk/portal/planning/pick your own

I would like to draw your attention to the response from Barratts who, given their way, want to build and build in Iwade. Some of the reasons they give are:

Iwade's improved infrastructure. Have they tried using the A249 or even getting in and out of Sittingbourne? The only new roads in Iwade are residential roads. Look at the problems on School Lane! What will it be like when the new (400) houses that are just being started are actually completed!

The many new facilities. Sorry, but I must have missed those. Do they mean the local supermarket, the chemist and the hairdressers? Ideal for a village, albeit an increasingly large one, but not an urban sprawl.

The need for workers for the new industrial companies at Ridham Docks. According to our MP, Gordon Henderson, we already have 3,000 unemployed in the area. Look at the speech Gordon Henderson gave to the House on the 5th May. It makes for interesting reading and deals with the traffic problem. The one that did not exist when planning permission was given for the increase in waste to Countrystyle and the new incinerator for Regis paper mill.

Barratts are not interested in our village as a community, or our lifestyle, but are only concerned with making more money.

If you want to protect the future of your village, now is the time to act BEFORE decisions are made at Swale. What to do.

They are certainly being listened to because they have rallied together. Let us show them that the residents of Iwade do care and that enough is enough. This threat will not go away unless we make it, so act NOW.

### Parish Council Notes Taken from the meeting held on the 9th March 2011

#### **Parishioner/ Public Time**

### Andy Sibley and Dan Beeson -

Countrystyle Group - The Chairman introduced the two gentlemen, who gave a brief outline of the recycling processes at the Ridham Dock site. They referred to the odour problems, due to the food waste process, and advised that they wanted the local community to contact them and report incidents. Clerk advised that the Group's contact number is now on the village website.

**Parishioners** – A representative from the Youth Club introduced two members who had put together a proposal for a skateboard park in the village. They outlined the details and the need for youths to have facilities within the village. They have been approached by Wards Homes, who are willing to provide funding towards it. Members queried on-going costs for maintenance and suggested the initial funding could possibly be raised through K.C.C. schemes.

A parishioner queried why a buffer zone (normally provided in advance of the development) is not shown on the plans for the Coleshall/School Lane development. Clerk to raise this with Swale Borough Council's Planning Section.
