



We have had a busy term at Tinkerbells, the children have planted vegetables and have been taking good care of them and are excited to see some of them growing already.


It is hard to believe that Term 6 is upon us already and we begin our final

IWADE PARISH COUNCIL - MINUTES OF THE MONTHLY PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Held on Wednesday 10 April 2019

Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Proposed by Cllr. Mills and seconded by Cllr. Dollimore, the Minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 13 March 2019 were agreed and signed as a true transcript.

Public Time

- 1. Visitors Representatives from Gilling Planning attended the meeting to outline the Care Home application (see below). This already has outline approval and the current application is for reserved matters. They mentioned that they had made provision for 25 car parking spaces, for visitors and staff; Councillors raised their concern that this would be insufficient.
- 2. County and Borough Councillors County Cllr. Whiting advised that the police are looking into reports of speeding in Stangate Drive after a resident raised concerns with him. There has been a lot of activity regarding alleged asbestos contamination at a site in Peach Blossom Drive; raised with Swale and the Environment Agency on behalf of residents. The MP and Cllr Dewar-Whalley have also raised it with Swale and the Health and Safety Executive. Cllr. Whiting is not aware of any enforcement action to date. He will keep pressing for clarification on whether there is a public health issue. KCC has launch a page to gather feedback on bus services. This will provide a greater understanding of what types of problems bus users experience and spot trends about the areas or on which services they arise. The information will be used to inform the conversations that KCC Public Transport have with bus operators through our Quality Bus Partnerships, or more generally to help improve things for bus users. KCC is encouraging people to use the form to let them know about their experience of using buses and the quality of service provided. The page is at


