






We thought it would be a lovely idea not just to waste the hair but instead to donate to the Little Princess Trust.

One of the activities that I have found a real blessing over the past several strange months of life has been going out for a walk. I have been able to walkfrom my house almost daily and have discovered so many local footpathsthat I was not previously aware of. I know many of you will have done the same. I give thanks every day that I can go for a walk. And I don't know about you but for me walking out during lockdown gave a sense of purpose and structure. It offered a sense of escape. It made such a difference. Walking became a time of refreshment and re-energising — physically, psychologically and spiritually.

One of the pleasures of walking is being able to notice the seasons changing and to observe nature in all its glory. I became much more aware of the need toslow down and to take time – time to look around and really seewhat is there- and time to listen. As I write this at the beginning of May I am particularly aware of all the different shades of green in the trees as the leaves start to unfurl and all the various colours and scents of the fruit blossoms. I am also aware that the birds are continuously singing - and that I have heard a cuckoo. Walking has taught me how beneficial these things are – and how much of our wonderful world we miss when we are rushing through life.

Often these thoughts and feelings have been the ones that feelweighty and problematic - but walking has offered the opportunity tolook at them differently and to put things into a new perspective.

And I also pray as I walk, offering to God my praise and thanks for the created world and sharing with him my reflections on life. I have become so much moreaware that he walks with me as my companion – drawing my attention to aspects of the world around me, and listening as I share with him my thoughts and feelings and my concerns.

And this is my prayer for you – that you can enjoy walking and that you may discoverGod walking with you – always close and always ready to listen.

Dog Fouling

Dog Faeces are something that many often come across when out for walks, it seems to be on the increase in Iwade and not only is it unpleasant but it is also a health hazard.

Toxocariasis is an infection transmitted from animals to humanscaused by the parasitic roundworms commonly found in the intestine of dogs. Who is at risk for toxocariasis? Anyone can become infected with Toxocara. Young children have a higher chance of becoming infected and worryingly this infection can cause blindness.

Swale Borough Council's Dog Warden attended a recent Parish Council meeting to try and help with this escalating problem. He gave the following advice to fight this antisocial behaviour of a few owners who do not clear up after their dog:

- 1. Report any incidents you see of Dog fouling direct to him 01795 417298- he will take the matter up. Photographs help or the identity of the dogowner is also useful.
- 2. Many residents in Iwade have 'Ring' doorbells and CCTV- recordings of dog fouling can be sent direct to him TimOxley@swale.gov.uk for follow up. It can also be reported via Swale Council's website https://swale.gov.uk/bins-littering-and-the-environment/littering/report-dog-fouling
- 3. A Dog Owner will receive a fine if their dog fouls and they don't clear it up immediately. The Public Spaces Protection Order Dogs on Lead and Dog Exclusions 2020 enforces this.
- 4. This Public Spaces Protection Order applies to any land which Swale Borough Council is responsible for including:
- land which is open to the air in any way
- •land which the public can have access to with or without paying
- public footpaths
- •grass areas beside a public pathway

Dog owners will receive a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) of £100 if your dog fouls and you don't pick it up immediately.
