# SPEEDWAY'S BELATED **BIRTHDAY**

In the early 1970's Ivor and Barry Thomas carved out a track in a disused field nestling between some wartime gun turrets just off Raspberry Hill Lane. In those days racing was on the original chalk surface and the safety fence was just a few straw bales! Out of these humble beginnings grew the track and facilities as we know them now and last year the club celebrated its 50th year of operation making it one of the longest standing speedway tracks in the country.

The track started out as a practice and training track with an occasional public meeting and apart from a brief try at league racing has remained so in its 50year history helping to produce two world champions, a British champion and giving hundreds of riders their first

taste of sliding a bike around a track.

Unfortunately, due to last year's Covid lockdown the planned 50th Anniversary meeting had to be cancelled and is now due to be run on Sunday 19th September. The meeting will be an individual race event featuring all our regular riders and with many older fans and riders coming along. A full meeting report will follow in next month's Observer.

Aside from the anniversary meeting the club remains very busy having run some well supported practice sessionsand having run

two rounds of our annual summer 4 team tournament series, the remaining rounds being due to be run in late October. The matches are always exciting with some good close racing plus there is always a125/150 and 250cc class races for the youngsters.

# You may qualify if \*:

- you are a low income household receiving certain means-tested benefits
- you or your partner are aged 65+ you or your partner get Pension
- Credit (including Guarantee Credit)
- if you or your partner do not get Pension Credit you may still be able to ask for a discount

You can call your supplier on the number on your bill to ask if you can get the Warm Home Discount or call Stevie if you need help with this

\*You must have an account to qualify. Each electricity supplier has different rules about who can get the discount.

You can only get this discount once a year. The Warm Home Discount is available through selected suppliers only. If you meet the rules you can get money off your electricity bills. Your electricity supplier will put £140 into your electricity account before the end of March 2022.

If you have a prepayment meter they will send you a voucher, when you top up your prepayment meter the £140 will be added to



Meet Stevie Pettitt, Fuel and Water Adviser for Swale working out of Children and Families Ltd.

This project has been funded by Swale Borough Council as part of their action on climate change and CO2 reduction. The aim of this project is to tackle fuel and water poverty across the borough and reduce CO2 emissions, saving householders money and energy, improving the health of the household and improve the householders understanding of energy efficiency.

We work with families that are in fuel poverty, with the most vulnerable groups, children elderly, disabled, and families on low incomes. We are giving free energy packs to householders who book a free consultation (chat) with me. The packcontains Swell gels, timers, LED light bulbs, draught proofing, radiator panels, humidifier, waste caddy bags, water hippos, to encourage householders to take further steps to save fuel.

The project is open to all households not just households considered to be in fuel and water poverty.

I work with households to switch tariff, apply for grants and support with utility debts. We give money saving and energy saving advice. We are trusted partners of local water suppliers and work to ensure households are on the correct water tariff.

On average most householders save a minimum of 20% on their annual water bills and switching tariff saves the householder approximately £190.00 a year.

As energy prices are set to rise in September and the Warm Homes discount opening in October it is important that as many households as possible are informed of the help and support that is available to them before the energy price hike. # "The Earth: Our Common Home, a Place for All"

"Wherever I lay my hat, that's my home". Remember this number one song? For those who love pub quizzes, can you name the singer and the year?

This sentiment feels especially poignant right now given the recent events in Afghanistan. People have literally left everything, setting off into the unknown to do just that; to find a place where they can lay their hat and call it home. But it's not just Afghanistan as the continuous flow of refugees seeking a safer place, risking everything to do so, reminds us. The recent generous response of the donations by so many gives grounds for hope for them in finding that new home in this country; a response rooted in the gospel call to "love thy neighbour".

"Home". This simple yet evocative word stirs deep yearnings within us as it touches upon questions of life, both in the here and now and for beyond death. At its most basic level home is a roof over our head, our own front door, food on the table, a comfy bed! It's a place where we can be secure, where we belong, where we can know we are loved and accepted for who we are, where we can rest, where we can be at peace at one with ourselves, with others around us and with our surroundings. For me this word speaks powerfully of the promise of the presence of the Lord's love with us: "we will come and make our home with them"1

In the church calendar we are in the Season of Creation, from September to Harvest at the start of October. We are thinking about the Earth as "Our Common Home: A Place for All"; for people and for wildlife alike. We are looking ahead to the COP26 conference in early November, when difficult choices will need to be faced given the climate crisis. For this is now a current reality not a future threat as recent events this summer have highlighted; the unprecedented rains and floods in Europe; raging forest fires. These capture headlines when other effects don't, such as the relentless rise in sea levels, threatening far-flung places both people and wildlife call home.

"The heavens declare the glory of God, the skies proclaim the work of his hands...day after day they pour forth speech, night after night they display knowledge" 2 Creation, this Earth is speaking, groaning in distress "as in childbirth" as the Bible puts it3. Will we heed this voice? Will we be willing to embrace the changes needed? What can we each do to make a difference where we are? This, so we can sing the song for us all to a place to lay our hat and call it home.
