Iwade Health Walks

What could be more enjoyable than walking companionably through fields and footpaths, perhaps spotting a heron or an oystercatcher, or listening to some croaking bull frogs – and all within a few minutes walk from the centre of Iwade? O.K. – it's not always quite so idyllic. The sun may not always shine; we may have to beat down the occasional bramble and nettle and there may be stiles to negotiate, but there is always a friendly helping hand close by and often plenty of laughter to cheer us on our wav.

Does this appeal to you? why not join us on our regular Thursday morning walk? Similar Health Walks are held regularly throughout East Kent, co-ordinated by the Eastern and Coastal Kent N.H.S Trust and are led by trained volunteers. The whole purpose of the scheme is to encourage people to improve their level of fitness and stamina through an enjoyable, nondemanding, sociable activity out in the open air. There is no need to commit to every week – just turn up when you can. Its advisable to bring a bottle of water, sun protection or wet weather gear as the weather dictates. There is no charge, just bring enough money for a drink at "The Woolpack" afterwards - to rehydrate ourselves after our exertions, of course!

We meet at 10.30 for 10.45 a.m each week in the square within the small shopping complex. There are several routes that we take, each lasting between 60 to 90 minutes and covering roughly three or four miles. One week may find us



walking through orchards and past hedgerows of blackberries and damson trees, just ripe for picking. At other times we may walk some of the Saxon Shore Way and across the marshes. The scenery is forever changing with the seasons and there is always something of interest to spot. Occasionally our walks may be taken further afield and we have been seen walking through the bluebells at Hucking and also enjoying the sea breezes at Minster!

Our walks are open to everyone but please bear in mind that the ground can be uneven and some of the stiles are a little tricky. Walkers walk at their own risk. Sadly we are unable to accommodate our four legged friends, however well behaved, as there is always the possibility of coming across various livestock and wild life that need to be protected, especially during the nesting season.

Hello Everyone. I thought I would tell you about a lovely interesting afternoon three of our members had in July.

A while ago, Glenn Walters suggested we start knitting for the Neo Natal Unit at Medway Hospital on our Knit & Natter afternoons that we have as an extra to our WI Monthly Meetings. There are several members who have come along to enjoy an afternoon at Glenn's house with tea, cake & good company. Glenn sort's out the patterns & a starter pack of wool & off we go. This lead to the afternoon at the Unit to hand over the box of Premature Baby clothes & Blankets. We made a prior arrangement to meet Mrs Pat Bagley (Charity Trust Coordinator) at the unit & when we arrived Pat took us along to meet Dr Aung Soe. The doctor in charge who made us very welcome. He was very interested in asking questions about the WI & just what we did at our monthly meetings. We told him

we have various speakers who come in to give talks on various subjects. The yearly resolutions we take on country wide i.e. Honey Bees from last year & Food Labelling this year. All these subjects are discussed & voted on country wide & taken up with Parliament & followed through.

This lead onto Dr Soe telling us about how the unit was started & how they work with the charity to make up the short fall of the NHS for the much needed equipment that the unit needs to enable them to continue there life saving work. Dr Soe & Pat then showed us around the Unit. We looked through the glass into the intensive & special care areas at all the incubators & electronic equipment keeping the tiny babies warm & comfortable. Some babies stay longer than others. All treated with such love & care. We were then showed into another area where there were two

fully equipped incubators ready



to go at a moments notice to transport premature babies safely back to the hospital. As we finished the tour we were treated to a cup of tea & chat with Pat. We can't praise them enough for the work they do & how welcome they made us.

Parish Council Notes Taken from the meeting held on the 14th July 2010

Parish Councillor Vacancies -

Five candidates put their names forward; three introduced themselves at the meeting; two could not attend due to prior commitments. Candidates were asked to leave the room whilst voting took place. During the first round of voting there was an outright majority for James Hunt; during the second for Stephen Plumb. Both signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office and were invited to join the Parish Council meeting. Joan Exley accepted the Parish Council's invitation to become a non-voting member of the Planning Committee.

Village Hall - The safety inspection report has been received from R.O.S.P.A.; the handyman has been instructed to carry out the necessary work and the Clerk has written to the Chairman of the Village Hall Committee regarding the areas that come under their iurisdiction. The Clerk has contacted the Land Registry and ascertained the procedure for making changes to the deeds for the village hall. There is the possibility of a £50 fee for this paper work - agreed.

Visitors/Public Time - County
Councillors and Borough
Councillor - Cllr. Whiting
referred to the quote for the
Village Hall car park and the
£16,000 he has available in grant
money which he can put towards
this project, but the work must
be carried out by Ringway. He will
investigate the possibility of

using other approved K.C.C. contractors and report back

Temp. Community Warden (Nick Mayatt) – report read out to Members – issues dealt with included fly-tipping, litter, noisy youths; the bus shelter.

Finance - Fraud by previous Clerk, Proceeds of Crime Act Hearing -

reference was made to the hearing and subsequent letter received from Kent Police which stated that as a result of her criminal conduct. Mrs George benefited by a total of £50,073.41 (the sum total of the funds stolen from both Iwade and Newington - £30,407 and £19,666.21 respectively). Sarah George was ordered to pay in compensation to Iwade and Newington Parish Councils the sum of £36,823 (to be split 60.7% and 39.3% respectively); which leaves a shortfall of £13,250.41p. It was proposed by Cllr. Wilks and seconded by Cllr. Manning that Louise Humphries (Solicitor) is appointed and instructed to approach the bank regarding this shortfall; she has agreed to charge a fee of £100 per hour for undertaking this work appointment agreed. Clerk has approached a professional Auditor, David Buckett, who has agreed to take on the task of auditing the Parish Council accounts. His hourly fee is £45, plus mileage. Agreed by Members to appoint David Buckett as the new Internal Auditor for Iwade Parish Council.

Photocopier Contract - the leasing company has issued an invoice for £2913.48p, being the full and final

settlement amount to cease the photocopier contract. Payment agreed by Members.

School Holiday Club – letter received from Iwade School requesting assistance with the shortfall in funds needed to finance the club. Proposed by Cllr. Wilks and seconded by Cllr. Manning that the Clerk write to the School seeking more information; details to be brought back to the next meeting in order that the Parish Council can fully consider this request.

Society of Local Council Clerks – Members agreed to the renewal of the subscription for 2010/11 at a cost of £95.

Cigarette Waste Bin – Clerk awaiting a response from Anne Ryman of Swale Borough Council regarding the provision of a bin at the bus shelter located adjacent to the village park.

SW/10/TEMP/0016 – Sustainable Energy Plant, Land to the East of Kemsley Paper Mill, Kemsley – Cllr. Wilks attended the site visit on the 7th July. The purpose of the visit was to familiarise KCC members with the application site and its environs.

East of Woodpecker Drive & Helen Thompson Close, Iwade – planning permission granted.
