Main tasks in all areas we are aiming to cover:

- 1. Picking up of all litter, rubbish etc
- 2. Sweeping of all pathways
- 3. Tidying of all grass edgings that border pathways, roadside etc
- 4. Cleaning of Path Signs, Road Signs etc
- 5. Identifying any areas that need attention by a specialist e.g. Large pot holes in road, broken fencing etc.

We are all being told to cut down on the amount of waste we send to landfill. There is one really easy way for you to help with the use of your own composter in your back garden. No excuses for it being too expensive either, as the Recycle Now Home Compost Campaign is a government funded scheme subsidizing the cost! Because they buy in such large yolumes direct from the

manufacturers the pass on the savings to you.

You can buy your own composter from as little as £8 including free delivery and help to reduce the amount of waste your household sends to landfill each month. It's not only easy (the kids can help too) but produces your very own compost in around six to nine months.

All you need to do is find the right site, ideally in the garden on bare soil so that the

worms can colonize. Add the right ingredients, from vegetable and fruit peelings to teabags and toilet rolls. A 50/50 mix of browns and greens is the best recipe for perfect compost!

# Community Warden

Update

Hello, Easter is here, before we know it Christmas will be around the corner. I have a lot to tell you this month

Kent Police statistics indicate that this is the time of year that thieves start targeting sheds, lawn mowers, tools and quad bikes.

You can reduce the chances of such equipment being stolen and assist in their recovery if they are stolen by following the simple guidelines below:

Never leave tools or machines lying around outside even for a short while - put them away safely.

Store tools and machines in a safe place - a secure shed, garage for instance.

Fit good quality locks to garages, sheds and other storage facilities (use British Standard locks).

Consider fitting an alarm and/or security lighting to your storage facility.

Disable ride - on lawnmowers and other ride on/large machines

Chain machines together and/or to solid anchorage points.

Record make, model, serial numbers and any distinguishing marks of tools and machines.

Use metal engravers to mark tools and large machinery with your postcode and house number or name.

#### Remember:

the longer a thief takes to steal something, the more visible he/she is while doing so, the more noise he/she makes in doing so and the riskier it is for him/her to dispose of property, the greater the chances are that will catch him/her.

Mid Kent Neighbourhood policing teams are leading a focused push to tackle criminal damage and other crimes that become more of a problem for people during this time of year.

Over the next few weeks, officers and staff will be taking targeted action across the six policing areas in the first of a series of seasonal Safer Kent campaigns.

Safer Spring sees neighbourhood patrols and partner agencies working to reduce criminal damage, antisocial behaviour, burglary and theft.

Patrols will work with communities to prevent this type of crime and there will be a series of activities to disrupt criminal behaviour and arrest people who have committed offences.

Mid Kent Police is also raising awareness on how people can stay safe and keep their property safe too.

Help keep your property safe:

Be vigilant and report any incidents or suspicions relating to criminal damage or antisocial behaviour. Do not leave windows open or valuables near windows Keep sheds and garages locked at all times, as this may act as an invitation to an opportunist thief.

Be aware that lighter, summer clothing may reveal where your wallet, mobile phone or media player is kept.

Do not carry large amounts of cash and ensure that you keep your PIN numbers safe.

Keep car windows and sunroofs locked. Do not leave valuables on view and remove or conceal and secure satellite navigation equipment and radios.

Boat owners preparing their vessel for the summer should ensure that equipment such as radio, GPS systems and outboard motors are safe and secure. Boat owners are also encouraged to keep records and photographs of their boat's identification numbers and markings.

You can also join a neighbourhood watch

scheme. For further details call the Swale NhW support office on freephone 0808 100 3308.

Happy Days
This month we thought we

This month we thought we would let you know about our "Healthy Eating, Happy child" approach that we use at Happy Days.

We believe that children's diet and exercise is paramount to a child's wellbeing. Careful consideration is therefore given to the meals provided starting from breakfast club until the children go home.

Our children are offered milk and water throughout the day. Our pre-school room have a water machine that they can help themselves to throughout the Breakfast begins with a selection of cereals and either croissants, bagels, crumpets or toast. Lunch is two courses, cooked freshly each day with plenty of fresh vegetables and only the best quality meat. "Fruit of the day" is advertised on our notice board and all children receive at least one piece of fruit a day. Any child attending all day will receive their '5 a day'.

The children participate in a number of healthy activities. The Pre-school room have their own dance lady who brings along Melody Bear on a Friday afternoon and change into shorts and T Shirt for dance. This helps them prepare for school and encourages them to learn to and undress themselves. All the nursery enjoy the activities in our extensive garden. summer we are introducing a separate area for our babies and new chalk boards are being fixed to the outside walls. We also have a new "garage" for our bikes and outside toys. (watch this space for new photographs). The balancing equipment is great fun and the children enjoy bug hunting and nature trails around the garden as well as playing on the swings, slides and climbing frames.

On Wednesday the children take it in turns to visit the kitchen where they learn about hygiene and the importance of good foods. They also learn to clear up and load the dishwasher (boys as well!).

Having completed Mother Day vases and lovely cards for their mums the children are now decorating candles and are looking forward to the Easter Egg Hunt before Easter and the Easter Bonnet competition, which was so successful last year. A local Headteacher will be judging the bonnets - encouraging our close links we have with many local primary schools in the area.

We currently have no places

in the nursery and have limited available for children 6 weeks to 3 years in September. Our pre-school room is now full for September, which reflects on the excellent service we offer to your children and their families.


Chester is a perfect family destination with its zoo, castle, the historic 'Rows' shopping's district, a river with boats to ride on and city

# Important information about ROAD CLOSURES on Sunday, 8 July 2007 This may affect you!

The world-famous *Tour de France* cycle race – the biggest annual sporting event in the world – visits Kent on Sunday 8 July 2007. This promises to be an exciting spectacle for families as well as for cycle racing fans and is completely free to watch. Kent is expecting many tens of thousands of spectators to visit the region. This is expected to provide a major economic boost to the county worth more than £37 million when visitors join the people of Kent to watch the race.

Because the whole of the Tour de France takes place on closed public roads, it will mean some inconvenience to drivers and to those who live or work on or near the route. The roads are closed to all traffic while the race itself and the carnival-style publicity 'caravan' ahead of it pass through.

Although the race is visiting Kent on a Sunday, the road closures, diversion routes and parking restrictions are bound to have an impact on local people. Kent County Council is working closely with district councils and the emergency services to make sure that the race passes safely and with as little disruption as possible. More detailed information will be given out nearer to the date of the race.

**PLEASE NOTE** that the roads will be **completely closed** for a minimum of five hours to allow the route to be prepared and the race to pass. Vehicles will not be allowed to drive on, park on or cross the race route and pedestrians will only be allowed to cross at certain points. There will be no vehicle access to buildings affected and there will be parking controls and other restrictions on and close to the race route. There will be no exceptions, although the emergency services will have full access at all times.

If you need to travel by car you will need to make alternative arrangements, perhaps by leaving home earlier or by parking somewhere different overnight. If your journey would normally cross the Tour de France route then you will have to follow a diversion, so please allow more time.


The information below, used with the route map on the back of this letter, gives APPROXIMATE likely road closure times. The letters refer to the labels on the map and the times given may change. They are based on the road being closed four hours before the race and opened one hour after it passes. PLEASE NOTE that the times and the labels refer to entry points into districts, not town centres.

- A: Entry to Dartford Borough estimated closure time 7.20am to 12.20pm
- B: Entry to Gravesham Borough estimated closure time 7.40am to 12.40pm
- C: Entry to Medway estimated closure time 8am to 1pm
- $\textbf{D:} \ \, \textbf{Entry to Tonbridge and Malling } \textbf{\textit{Borough}} \text{ estimated closure time 8.20am to 1.20pm}$
- E: Entry to Maidstone Borough estimated closure time 8.30am to 1.30pm
- $\textbf{F:} \ \, \textbf{Entry to Tonbridge and Malling } \textit{Borough} \text{ estimated closure time 8.50am to 1.50pm}$
- **G:** Entry to Tunbridge Wells *Borough* estimated closure time 9.15am to 2.15pm
- H: Entry to Ashford Borough estimated closure time 10am to 3pm
- I: Entry to Shepway District estimated closure time 11.15am to 4.15pm
- $\mbox{\em J:} \quad \mbox{Entry to Canterbury $\it City$ estimated closure time $11.30$am to $4.30$pm}$
- K: Canterbury finish zone estimated closure time 5am to 9pm

Details of road closures, parking restrictions and changes to public transport will be published nearer to the event. Visit www.kent.gov.uk/tourdefrance or www.tourdefrancelondon.com, look out for details in your local newspapers and on roadside signs and listen in to local radio stations.

I hope that you will join me in watching the race and in welcoming this spectacular world-class sporting event to Kent.

### Messages from...

#### I ne Churchwardens

As you are all probably aware, All Saints Iwade is at present part of a six Parish Benefice which comprises, Newington, Hartlip & Stockbury, Upchurch with Lower Halstow & Iwade. Rev. Bill H6rnsby the Priest-in-Charge retires at the end of April, and plans are underway for Iwade to leave this Benefice and to be linked with Holy Trinity, Milton Regis later this year. A new Minister will be licensed as Priest-in-Charge there in September, and it is planned for a Missioner to work closely with him and to be resident in Iwade. We are all very excited at the prospect.

In the meantime, services and events continue, with Rev. Webb together with Rev.

Partridge and Rev. Davies leading our services.

We have 6 weddings booked so far for this year. The church is a lovely setting for these happy occasions.

The Songs of Praise event previously announced to be held in Upchurch Village Hall on April 29th has been cancelled. That is the date of Rev. Hornsby's last service.

Now the days are warming a little, walk along The Street one second Saturday in the month and come and have a walk around your church, if you haven't found us yet. Church is opposite the Woolpack - well sign posted. Look forward to meeting you. You'd be very welcome too for the Coffee Morning on last Wednesday of month at 10.30. Come and try us for hour or so.

#### All Saints Church

'Now the Lord said to Abram "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great so that you will be a blessing...". Genesis 12.1,2.

The year 2006 to 2007 has been one of significant development in the lives of the six parishes. Individuals and parishes have been prepared to follow God's call faithfully and to set out, leaving behind much that was familiar and comfortable, to discover new ways of relating and serving God's purpose. An enormous amount has been achieved; there have been great frustrations at the slow pace of some developments; and it is with considerable regret that I prepare this final article as I prepare to respond to what I perceive as the next stage of God's call on my life and retire from the office of Priest in Charge.

significant most development, I believe, has been to observe how 'two groups of three parishes' have found effective ways of working as a single 'group of six'. This is due, in no small measure, to the great gifts of grace and generosity of the team of lay and ordained People have been leaders. prepared to be tolerant and to show forbearance as new and different ways have been revealed of doing what has been long-accepted and wellunderstood.

The pace of change has been challenging. When the 'jobdescription' for Priest in Charge of Newington, Hartlip and Stockbury was circulated early in 2004 it was expected that those three parishes would join with Upchurch, Lower Halstow and Iwade under a single leadership after 'a couple of years' of working alongside each other. In fact, by the time of the publication of this magazine we will already have been 'amalgamated' as an 'informal cluster' for something in excess of eighteen months. New patterns of working as a Team Ministry are well settled down; colleagues have grown into their new roles and responsibilities; individual parishes have been able to retain their distinctive identity whilst sharing in the benefits which flow from being part of a wider group.

During that process of change

the folk at Iwade have been especially tolerant of the 'stops and starts' of the process of realignment with Milton. commitment, by the Diocese, to fund a new 'missioner-post' to serve Iwade and Milton under the supervision of the Vicar of Milton was warmly embraced. By now it is to be hoped that a new appointee will have been identified to serve at Milton which, in turn, will allow the process of selecting and appointing for the missioner to move ahead. After this, a realignment of responsibilities will follow resulting in 'six' becoming 'five'.

And it will be to 'five parishes' that my successor will be appointed. The formal meetings leading to the definition of new Parish Profiles and a new 'jobdescription' are time-tabled and, if everything moves according to plan, a new minister will be licensed on the 30th October this year.

Sylvia and I have greatly enjoyed our (nearly) three years in this area. The warmth and kindness of each community has been immensely supportive. I count it one of the greatest privileges of my life to have had the opportunity to serve in this situation and leave confident that the parishes will be in good hands during the period of interregnum and with the certainty that God will continue to support and uphold us all in everything that lies ahead.
