Wards Homes in Court

The Planning Director of Ward Homes has appeared in court accused of destroying the habitat of the Great Crested Newt in the Orchard by Woodpecker Drive.

Mick Drury, was arrested following agricultural work at the Old Apple Orchard in Woodpecker Drive, in November 2004. He gave instructions to a contractor to turn the scruffy land, rated as an "excellent" habitat for great crested newts, into an area where animals could graze.

Mick Drury is charged with a breach of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and appeared before Sittingbourne Magistrates in February. Mick Drury denies intentionally or recklessly damaging the land and says he was "simply cutting the grass".

Police were called to the Orchard on November 26th, 2004 by English Nature after they were informed of the work by ecologist Dr Lee Brady. He had written a report on Iwade earlier in the year and recommended that because of the orchard's potential for sheltering newts, no development should be carried out until a more in depth survey had been conducted.


Mr Brady reported that he was at home when he received a telephone call from the Parish Clerk of Iwade who told him what was happening. Dr Brady was greatly concerned and drove to

Iwade to investigate. When Dr Brady arrived he saw a large forest mulcher machine working on the land, driven by HG Timber.

The contractor advised the Parish Clerk and Dr Brady that his instructions were to clear the site and to mulch all the trees on the site. Dr Brady rang Mick Drury on his mobile and advised him that he had ordered the work to stop.

Mick Drury rejected claims made by Mary Jacobson, prosecuting, that he had deliberately damaged the land so he would not have to obtain a Defra licence for development. Mr Drury stated that the development was at least 5 years away and, if planning permission was granted, the newts could easily be relocated.

The trial continues.....

Important Notice from the Parish Council

Southern Water would like to remind all residents of Iwade that we are still on water restrictions. Southern Water still have in force an increased level of water restrictions in its Kent Supply area to full hosepipe, jetwash, sprinkler ban and similar apparatus.

They have received reports that residents of Iwade are using sprinklers, jetwashes, hosepipes for the watering of private gardens, washing down paintwork, or the washing of cars etc. Although we have had rain and snow this has not been sufficient to

lift this restriction and this restriction is absolutely essential to manage the demand for water following the second driest winter since 1904 which has severely affected the level of water resources...

The Councillors of Iwade Parish Council would like to advise residents that Southern Water are monitoring and recording the water supplies and any person who contravenes these prohibitions will be prosecuted by Southern Water.

This ban is until further notice and took effect from Monday 11th July 2005.

Kent Community Warden will hit the Streets of Iwade once Again

Following the successful employment of Sue Seamon and her sad departure in September 2005, Iwade has been without this key support The recruitment progress for our new warden has been done his Kent County Constabulary training completed. Iwades new Community Warden will be walking the streets of Iwade in February.

With the vandalism increasing within the village since Sue's departure, this is a welcome relief to some residents of Iwade as well as the Parish Council. Especially now that the village centre is open to access and it has already been reported that about ten youths

on bicycles and one motorbike have already started to congregate in the village centre in the early hours of the morning by the steps messing around with the plastic barriers.

Community Warden Jerry Cox will no doubt be introducing himself to the residents of Iwade, getting familiar with the local activities etc. Like his predecessor, Jerry will be the eyes and ears for the Parish Council reporting on low level anti social behaviour He will have certain Police powers and can issue fixed penalty notices for littering and dog fouling, he will also have powers to deal with people cycling on the pavement, fly posting, graffiti, properties that are open to access and a danger to the public and a range of other environmental issues.

Community Warden Jerry Cox has asked the Iwade Village News to remind residents about the Anti Social Behaviour Reporting Line (01795 417575) this is not a fast response line and that any serious incident should be reported to the Police in the usual manner. The line is

open from 9am to 5pm Monday to Wednesday, 9am to 9pm Thursday to Saturday and 2pm to 9pm Sundays (answer phone outside these hours).

The Parish Council in partnership with Community Warden Jerry Cox, the Police, local residents and other local agencies is determined to combat Anti Social behaviour in our streets. No one should live with it and with our combined commitment we can make a difference.

Also with effect from Sunday 5th February ALL SWALE AREA POLICE TELEPHONE NUMBERS WILL CHANGE with the exception of 01795 477055 & of course 999.

The Chairman led a lineby-line discussion of the precept and. after discussion, and taking into account the amount of vandalism the Parish Council had to deal with. proposed that it should be increased by 50p. This was seconded by Cllr Malcolm Hutchings majority vote and passed.

Re:SW/05/TEMP/0070. Countryside Recycling Ltd, Development of waste recovery facility including vessel in composting materials, recovery facility (MRF) and continued use for recycled secondary aggregate production at Countrystyle Recycling Ridham Dock, Ltd. **Iwade**

At its meeting Thursday 12th January 2006 the Iwade Parish Council Planning Committee raised no objections to this application in principal. However, referring to the OUTLINE **SURFACE** WATER MANAGEMENT PLANs No.659909 Co4 and Co5 which indicate **'OUTLET TO EXISTING** WATERCOURSE' (TO BE CONFIRMED BY **ENVIRONMENT** AGENCY).

The Iwade Parish Council is concerned that surface water from the Composting Plant will not be allowed to pollute the adiacent water courses. The ditches which surround the site are linked to the south easterly tip of the SSSI/Ramsar Site, that the Coldharbour is Marshes. The easterly of the Ridham Marshes 500m to the north of the site is adjacent to the Ridham Outfall to The Swale. We trust that suitable Planning Conditions will be attached to the Grant of Permission to develop the site, following liaison with the Environment Agency.

It should be noted that Martin Newcombe (appendix K) states in paragraph 3.1: 'potential for crested newts occurs

'in the latter case this could mean that there would be a need for DEFRA licensing newts were present on other land nearby. No survey for great crested (Triturus newts cristatus) could be carried out due to the time of year.....

4.6....there does appear to be a need for a great crested newt survey in season.

In 4.4 Martin Newcombe states 'There are no dykes on the site or close enough to be affected that might contain water vole, and the species appears to be absent from this part of the Swale marshlands'. A survey conducted in October 2001, by Ecoscope for the SITA Public Inquiry found evidence

nearby' and in para 4.3 Water Vole in the ditch alongside the Ridham Dock Access road. The proposed development site is approximately 1100m from the dock access road.

> The Iwade Parish Council accepts that the proposed development site will not support great crested newts and other herptile populations; however we consider that an appropriate survey of the adjacent ditches should be undertaken in the Spring. Recent surveys around Iwade have established that there is metapopulation of great crested newts. The development site is 1.25km approximely from Iwade, the Iwade stream drains into the Coldharbour Marsh.

Today it is FREEZING even though the garden is trying to tell me that Spring is on its way, with the bulbs bravely getting taller each day and the winter pansies making bright splashes of colour.

A Little reminder that the church of All Saints, Iwade (you'll find it opposite the Woolpack), is open for visitors on the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10am to 2pm. This service is very suitable for the children, as is the monthly family services on 4th Sundays, in which the children are the main focus with their own craft section. Usually lasts about 45 mins.
