# buses

Arriva is welcoming the opportunities the opening of the new Swale Crossing will bring to improving bus services in the area. services on the Isle of Sheepy have been stable for a number of years as major new developments have been constrained by transport infrastructure.

Whilst some services on the mainland in the area between



Kingsferry bridge and Sittingbourne have seen changes largely as a result of

developments at Iwade, the challenges of reliably crossing the Swale have stifled growth. The good news is that there will be two significant changes to services in Swale area during the early part of 2006. First, the service between Kemsley and Sittingoburne, the 349 has been successful in a bid by Kent County



Council, with Arriva support, funding from the Governments' Kickstart Challenge scheme.

The arrival of this funding will enable new easy6 access buses to be introduced on the service, better information at the bus stop and extra journeys in the early evenings to improve connections with

Secondly, the new Swale crossing will ensure faster and more reliable journey times which will make a new bus service to Maidstone from the Isle of Sheppey a practical proposition

Arriva will be introducing a new hourly service, the 334, on Monday to Fridays only, between Sheerness, Minster, Halfway Queenborugh, Iwade, Sittingbourne and Maidstone.

The first journey Sheerness through Maidstone will be around 9am with the last through journey back from Maidstone just before 5pm.

This service, along with the existing 333 which runs between Faversham, Sittingbourne and Maidstone will mean there will be two journeys an hour on Mondays Fridays between Sittingbourne and Maidstone.

#### The Difference

This is a very strange letter to write, I'm sitting at my desk on New Year's Day surrounded by the Christmas lights etc., but when you read this we will be looking towards Lent and Christmas will be a distant memory. I know the shops will be full of Easter eggs, as I have already seen them.

The frantic pace at which our world moves drives us through the seasons will little or no time to consider the implications for us. Everyone seems to be in a hurry to get one season or shopping opportunity over and race onto the next one.

In my Christmas sermons I used the theme of the difference that Christmas makes, or should make to our lives. The false illusion that the world gives of Christmas is that at this particular season everyone will celebrate peace and good will and everyone will get on for one day. The real difference that we celebrate at Christmas is the great love God has for us that he gave his son in love for us and we are required to show that love for those who we meet, work with and live with, not just at Christmas, but every day of our lives.

This is such a powerful fact; we cannot rush over it and

not think about it from one year to the next. The incarnation makes a difference to our lives every day, not just at Christmas, indeed as we begin to consider our journey towards Easter, we cannot gloss over the implications of Christmas.

As we travel towards Easter and begin our Lentern reflections, I would suggest we all consider the love given for us and how we can reflect that love to a world so badly in need of it. It may be we have influence in local or national government or it may be we can do nothing more than a smile or a touch on the arm of someone hurting, all are ways of showing the difference God's love makes in the world today.

This year let's keep the incarnation alive in our hearts all year and let each one of us work out a way we can make a difference.

### Parish Council Notices

The Parish Council meets every second Tuesday in the month at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

At the December meeting The Chairman opened the meeting by introducing representatives from Ballast Phoenix, who specialise in recycling Incinerator Bottom Ash.

The Parish Council were advised that Ballast Phoenix already operated 3 sites in England all of which took bottom ash.

Ballast Phoenix gave a 30 minute presentation, stating that they had been in operation since 1998 and to

date had no environmental problems and always had approval Local from Authorities. Their environmental impact consisted of reductions on land field sites, they recycled waste into products, created local employment, produce no noise, no dust and there was no danger to the local environment. All noise was contained inside the operating buildings.

Concerns from the Parish Council were raised about dust and Ballast Phoenix explained the extensive programme on site that kept the dust down, by spraying plant, stock and lorry wheel washes and they installed windbreaks. They conducted regular checks on employees and periodic check on dust and all were always well within the national dust level standards.

Ballast Phoenix proposed that they wished commence on site in January 2006 and commission the plant in May 2006 in order to meet with Allington Incinerator deadlines. The Parish Council advised Ballast Phoenix that these deadlines were not realistic and would not be met.

### Iwade Youth Club Minibus

Lesley Hunt from Kent Police wrote to the Parish Council requesting a donation of £500 to go towards the cost of purchasing a mini bus to be used for the youth club. Members of the Parish Council agreed to the sum in principal and it was agreed that the Clerk would contact Mrs Hunt and advise her that

the sum of £500 had been earmarked for this project on the condition that the target of £20,000 was reached

### Boundary dispute

Parish Council received a letter from residents of Turnstone Close and Helen Thompson regarding Constantine Construction building houses on their land. It was agreed that although the Parish Council had no authority in this problem. The Clerk and Chairman would speak to residents to offer their support. Chairman to speak to Swale Borough Council about this in support of this complaint.

#### Church Sign

Clerk received a letter from Baptie advising that the Church did not fall into the category of historic interest to warrant a tourism sign, as they did not meet with their criteria.

#### **Finance**

Clerk to contact Kent County Council, Highways to see if directional sign could be installed instead.

The Parish Council were advised that the Tax Rate for 2006/07 for Iwade was 885.97 and the budget for the precept for 2006/07 would be discussed and

agreed in the January Parish Council meeting

Clerk received grounds maintenance quote from Landscape Services for 2006 this was increase of £25.03 to £651.32. It was proposed by Vice Chair Phil Fearn to continue with this contract and the grass and maintenance at recreation ground was to a high standard, this was seconded by Cllr Susan Dowling, all Parish Councillors present were in agreement.
