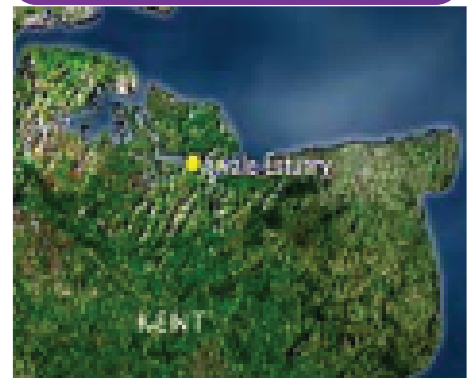


## Estuary & Orchards Update

## Iwade Village Hall Dedication Stone

"Ladies and Gentleman, as chairman of the Iwade Village Hall Management Committee, I welcome you to Iwade Village Hall today on this special occasion to unveil the memorial stone. 52 years ago, in 1957, this land was donated to the people of Iwade by Sir Leslie Doubleday, who owned this land, to build a new village hall. The people then set about raising the money to build it and the stone was set in the front of the building to commemorate the generosity of Mr Doubleday. The hall is very much the same now as it was then and is still run voluntarily



by the people of Iwade. We have recently had the front of the hall painted and the memorial stone has been refurbished. Mrs Connie Kilby was one of those fund-raisers, 52 years ago, who helped to

build and run the Hall. She and her family have had a hand in keeping it going throughout the years ever since. I have great pleasure in asking Mrs Kilby to unveil the memorial stone today."

# Iwade Broadband Survey

Many thanks to all the Iwade residents who completed the Broadband Survey Questionnaire. The results have now been analysed and compiled into a report which is available on the Iwade Village website. In summary the report confirmed the overall level of dissatisfaction with the current broadband service in the village with over 50% of residents rating the service they receive as 'Poor' or 'Very Poor'. The survey indicates that for future broadband provision residents place a high priority on download speeds, consistent availability, and cost. With

regard to cost 67% of residents are prepared to pay up to £20 per month for their future broadband service, this is in line with current costs and indicates that residents are reluctant to significantly increase their monthly costs for broadband. The results of the survey have helped to form the key criteria in reviewing the nine tenders received to supply broadband to Iwade. An initial review of the tenders received has now been completed and the Broadband Committee is now progressing the most promising tenders with the suppliers and Kent County Council.

## Dog Owners

Iwade residents are reminded to clean up after their dogs. Some of you still aren't picking up after your dogs in Woodpecker Drive Park, and School Lane playing fields. It's not the responsibility of SBC or the Parish Council to come along and clean up after your dogs, it's yours! Please take plenty of bags with you, use them, and clean up the mess. Iwade Parish Council had two new dog bin plastic bag dispensers installed a while ago in the School Lane playing field, and in Woodpecker Drive Park. Now the replacement bags have been delivered, it's being monitored on a weekly basis to make sure it's re-filled. The bags are there if you need them but residents are reminded to take their own plastic bags whilst walking their dogs. These open areas are used by many residents, including children and Iwade Herons football team. Please be considerate, and clean up after your dog.

# October in the Garden by Ann Menzies



Nights are drawing in, and soon the clocks will be changing, meaning for many of us the only time for the garden will be at weekends. If you grow your own vegetables then you may still have some stuff to help tide you over until the new crops next year, like celeriac, sprouts, mooli radish and kale. If you didn't get these going earlier in the year investigate what you could plant next year to fill the gap. Clear away any old vegetable plants; healthy plant material can go into the compost bin, but any that shows signs of pests or disease is better disposed of with the household rubbish unless you have the facilities to burn it safely. Slugs and snails will be looking for any sheltered spots for a winter rest, so a clean-up can help reduce their numbers next year, although beneficial insects will also be looking for similar winter berths; you need

to weigh up what's best in your garden. Although many magazines will have advised you to get bulbs planted in September, it's still not too late, and indeed tulips are better planted this month. There should still be plenty of choice available, so think about those dull places in your garden last spring, and fill them up with spring flowering bulbs now. Pots planted up with ornamental cabbage, cyclamen and pansies will provide colour well into the winter months. To get the most from the pots, put spring flowering bulbs in first, then put the other plants on top. The bulbs will flower as the others finish, providing a succession of colour well into the spring. I found miniature daffodils worked really well, but the mix of black and white tulips was less successful; the white ones were over before the black ones flowered!

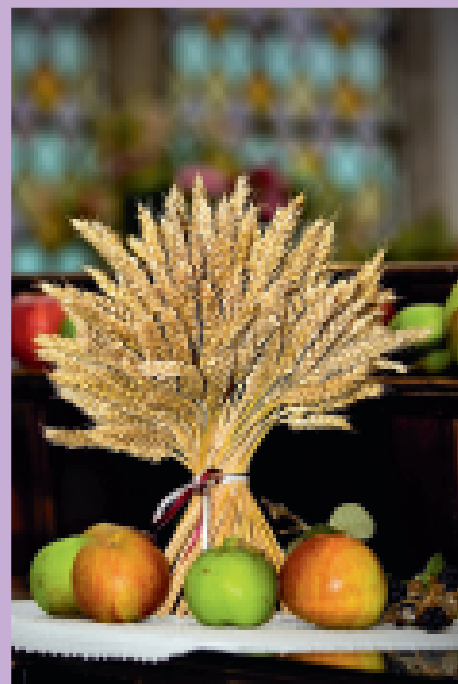

# Parish Council Notes from meeting of 9th July 2009

ROSPA Report on School Lane Playing Field – the two baby swing seats will be taken down and replaced.

Bus Shelter, Grovehurst Road/Seat – Swale B.C. will look at installing the seat in the Village Centre play area, but would like further details.

Barretts have asked if the Parish Council will store the seat as they are relocating their Sittingbourne depot.

Gate/Sign at Village Entrance/Bushes/Weight Restriction Signs –informed by Highways that the gateway adjacent to the Medical Centre will not be reinstated as it is due to be moved (this is linked to the proposed Hillreed development).

Highways have issued orders to the owners to cut back the bushes in The Street (near to the pub) and the corner of School Lane/The Street (the Village Centre).

Following confusion over weight restrictions signs it has been confirmed that all signs are present in their correct location. Clerk has received a copy of the Order and a map showing the location of the signs from PCSO Woods.

Litter Bins/Graffiti Buster - Anne Ryman who has promised to supply details of the location of litter bins and frequency of emptying. Cllr. Stokes has spoken to Anne about obtaining more litter bins – Cllr. Derek White suggested siting one next to the new bus stop in Grovehurst road and another outside the village hall. Anne Ryman has confirmed that the Graffiti Buster team still visits Iwade; if details of problem

areas are passed to the Clerk, she in turn can give Anne a list for the team.

Southern Water – no progress to date on arranging a meeting despite chasing this firm.

Iwade Broadband Committee – Cllr. Gregory recalled the last Parish council meeting when it was agreed that a loan of £50 be granted to the Committee for the cost of printing the questionnaires. She apologised and stated that this amount should have been £150, plus £10 for collection boxes – agreed.

Borough Cllr. Ben Stokes reported he has been allocated £2,000 for community projects.

County Cllrs. Mike Whiting and Alan Willicombe each have £10,000 grant money. There is also £25,000 available for highway issues; this is extra to any planned spending.

Highways funding can be applied for year on year, rolling over until the Parish council has enough money to carry out a project.

Residents referred to the proposal for a second Incinerator at Kemsley Mill.

Members were unable to comment as they have only received the Scoping Report. Once planning has been lodged Parish Council will be able to put forward its / parishioners' views. At the appropriate time the Parish Council will hold a public meeting to hear views.

Kent Air Ambulance have written seeking a site for a textile bank. The Parish Council does not own land suitable for this use. Clerk to reply to Kent Air Ambulance, suggesting that

they contact the Woolpack.

Litter: Agreed that the Parish Council approach those organisations that they fund, requesting they set aside one or two days per year for litter picking.

Village Handyman: The Chairman introduced Steve Wakeling, the new Village Handyman.

Community Orchard Project: Francis Fielding from Groundwork is looking at regenerating the orchard to the rear of the village park in liaison with Graeme Tuff from Swale; land that will be released with the next phase of Barrett Homes development. They have a grant of £7000 from National Trust and are looking to raise additional funding from other bodies and the Parish Council.

The project incorporates bringing the old orchard back to life; saving what trees they can; planting new and providing a habitat for wildlife, which includes the Great Chafer Beetle. They will train people to maintain the orchard, with the resulting produce being sold and the money ploughed back into the village, or for villagers' use. The orchard can also be used by families for leisure purposes.

The Village Park has not yet been handed over to Swale – this matter has been outstanding for 8 years. Clerk to request the land is handed over or for legal action to be taken.

Matter to be deferred until the Parish Council has more facts and the land is in the ownership of the Borough Council.

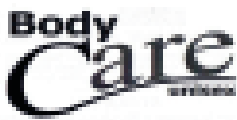

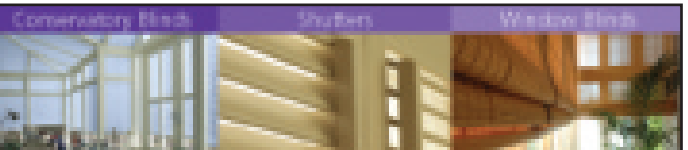

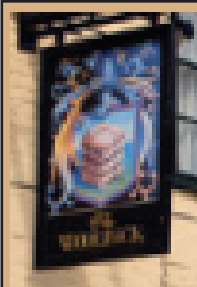
