Kemsley Mill *by Linda Gordine*



I wonder how many of you have read the 'Glossy', distributed to some homes in Iwade, which outlines the proposal for energy supply expansion at Kemsley Mill? The article explains how good the plan is for the Mill - but I question how good it will be for Iwade in terms of air quality, land and water table contamination risk and transport nuisance. The Environment Agency website lists what is in our backyard. Kemsley Mill is logged as a 'Pollution Hazard' with an operator performance of only average (latest published date of 2007). When you look at the pollutants

released into the air, and what each of them can do to people, it is frightening (www.environment-agency.gov.uk/homeandleisure/37793.aspx). This takes you to maps, where it's enlightening to look at Industrial Pollution and Air Pollution in our area. The link shows pollution incidents where a significant or major incident has occurred but what about the minor ones? In Iwade I've noticed a distinctive smell that permeates the air on some occasions. My husband thinks it's something to do with farming and the surrounding fields but I'm not convinced. To me, manure doesn't have such a sweet sickly smell. If anyone can shed some light on this I'd be very grateful. Anyway back to the main issue: More Power to the Mill states that already the Mill uses paper sludge from the effluent treatment process and plastic contaminants. Their plan is to bring in pre-treated waste products to turn

into electricity and steam. The leaflet states that the fuel would be 'hard to re-cycle waste materials, sourced and pre-treated off site'. My query is - what are the waste products and what have they been treated with? If the waste is to be stored then what safeguards will be in place? St Regis estimates four deliveries per hour, by lorries, which could equate to 32 loads per day! The article states that there are excellent road links. That may be so but the roads in this area are becoming congested and there are always problems with accidents on the 249. I have many other uncertainties, which I hope to pursue at the public exhibition in Kemsley Village Hall towards the end of this week. Kent County Council is already involved in the early stages of research and I think that Iwade should be at the forefront and prepared for what could be just around the corner.

Parish Council Meeting Notes

Extract from 22nd May Planning Meeting

Cllr Wilks was elected Chairman for the Planning Committee.

Parish Council has tried to preserve Woodpecker Drive area for its biodiversity and wildlife. It is a habitat of the highly protected Great Crested Newt and the Noble Chafer Beetle, recently discovered on this land, which is also protected and was thought to be extinct in Kent.

Hillreed and Ward Homes (Barratts) Development Brief

The Chairman referred to the flooding in the village and commented that Shaun Fury of Campaign to Preserve Rural England is assisting.

The draft shows a small increase in the size of School Lane playing field – 1.3 hectares but no land for formal sports provision as promised in the original master plan for Iwade.

The Chairman stated that there must be 30% affordable housing with some three storey dwellings and 40 dwellings to the hectare. Cllr Gregory stated that the elderly and disabled had not been taken into account and the developers should consider bungalows. She also commented that the allotments had failed to materialise.

Residents were concerned that the end of the roadway in Helen Thompson Close will be opened up to create an access route into the new development and resulting traffic will create a hazard for children.

Points to raise in the response:

- Query why there is no land for formal sports provision.
- No allotment land.
- Bus shelter needed for School Lane.
- We need to clarify that we will get a haul road.

Extract from 12th May Parish Council

Cllr. Gregory informed Councillors that she is chairing the Broadband Committee of 10 members which is communicating with KCC Nicola McKenzie is co-ordinating.

PSCO Lindsay Woods reported the following PACT priorities

1. Litter and fly-tipping
2. Anti-social behaviour
3. Parking issues

Cllr. Gregory reported vehicles were using Dunlin Walk footpath as a short cut from the village centre and residents request that a bollard be installed at each end.

Clerk will contact KCC. to reinstate the gate and sign at the Medical Centre entrance to the village.

Parish Precept 2009/10 –Swale Borough Council state that the Parish Precept has been increased by £399 (this was not at the request of the Parish Council) to address the shortfall with the parish lighting expenses.

Councillors to consider writing to the Local Council Ombudsman regarding this issue and the Clerk was asked to put this item on June agenda.

Extract from 14th April Parish Council

Ward Homes requested Parish Council take responsibility for new Grovehurst Road bus shelter.

Re the Iwade Community Orchard Project Cllr Hurrell volunteered to report back at the next meeting.

Parish Council's insurance policy with Allianz is due for renewal on 1st June with premium £1148.51. Clerk will ensure that Grovehurst Road bus stop is covered.

Note from Swale reference Hillreed and Ward Homes Development Brief

Subject to some further work (including screening for an Appropriate Assessment), Members at the Local Development Framework Panel on 25th June agreed to recommend to the Council's Executive that both Briefs be adopted.

Update from Cllr Wilks Planning

Cllr Wilks pointed out that in the 30 page Annex A - Responses to Public Consultations the only good news appeared to be an acknowledgement of steps to provide allotment land. A major concern to the Parish Council is the flooding problems arising from the Iwade Stream which was hoped the Developers would resolve as required by the Swale Local Plan Policy. So far this is not happening as they can not get support from the Environment Agency. Local member Ben Stokes attended the 25th June meeting referred to above and spoke on all the issues raised by Iwade residents including flooding, drains, the stream, unadopted roads, Helen Thompson and Woodpecker concerns, over development, wildlife, allotments, road calming, sports facilities and issues re being overlooked amongst others. Thanks Ben.
